Scope: These rules shall apply to this contract.

Underlying: The Underlying for this Contract is <player/athlete>'s <time period> fantasy points, in Points Per Reception (PPR) scoring, single-quarterback (non-Superflex) fantasy football terms. The relevant figure is the total <time period> PPR fantasy-point value published by the Source Agency for <player/athlete> at the Expiration time, read to the number of decimal places published by the Source Agency with no additional rounding applied by Kalshi. Revisions to the Underlying made after Expiration will not be accounted for in determining the Expiration Value.

Instructions: The Underlying can be found in the <time period> total PPR scoring leaders published by the Source Agency for the relevant NFL regular season. These instructions on how to access the Underlying are provided for convenience only and are not part of the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time.

Source Agency: The Source Agency is Sleeper.

Type: The type of Contract is an Event Contract.

Issuance: The Contract is based on the outcome of a recurrent data release, which is issued on an annual basis. Thus, Contract iterations will be issued on a recurring basis, and future Contract iterations will generally correspond to the next <time period>.

<time period>: <time period> refers to a segment of a specified NFL game or the season at which a specified NFL game is played, as specified by the Exchange. <time period> may take, but is not limited to, the following forms:

- Entire game, which refers to the time period encapsulating regulation time and overtime
- Entire game excluding overtime (i.e., regulation time only), which refers to regulation time with no overtime
- Overtime or extra periods only
- A quarter or half specified in the singular or in the plural when used with AND/OR operators (e.g., first quarter and second quarter, first half or second half, third quarter)
- Where <time period> takes the form of second half or fourth quarter, this shall be understood to not include overtime unless otherwise specified by the Exchange
- Any quarter or half across the entire game or a subset of the game, which may be satisfied if at least one of the aforementioned segments of the game meets the stated Payout Criterion
- Each quarter or half across the entire game, or each subset of the game, which may be satisfied if ALL of the aforementioned segments of the game meet the stated Payout Criterion
- Unless otherwise specified, a quarter shall be understood to refer to a regulation quarter not including overtime
- A given time period denoted in hours and/or minutes and/or seconds of game clock time, or constrained by a given time in a stated timezone (e.g., prior to 7PM ET)
- A given segment or subsection of a competition, season, or the competition/season in its entirety

<time period> may also take the forms of any segment in a set range, refer in the singular or the multiple, by distinguishing characteristics (e.g., any football game involving a team from Texas), "Any" or "None." Where not specified otherwise, <time period> shall be understood to refer to the sum of regulation time and overtime. <time period> may also be expressed as a calendar year (e.g., "2026"), a calendar month and year (e.g., "January 2026"), a calendar quarter (e.g., "Q1 2026"), a specific week, a season (e.g., "2026-27 NFL Season"), or other bounded time periods as appropriate to the contract subject matter. All time periods are interpreted in Eastern Time (ET) unless otherwise specified. The end of <time period> is defined as 11:59:59 PM ET on the final day of the specified period unless otherwise specified. The Exchange may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to variations of <time period>.

<player/athlete>: <player/athlete> refers to a single natural person, or to a specified set of two or more natural persons, designated by the Exchange. Each such person is identified as the individual natural person regardless of team, position, jersey number, or any subsequent change to that person's name, and is tracked through any such change. Where the Exchange designates a set of two or more persons, the Contract will state whether the Payout Criterion is evaluated conjunctively ("AND" — satisfied only if the stated condition holds for every person in the set) or disjunctively ("OR" — satisfied if the stated condition holds for at least one person in the set); absent an express statement, the condition is evaluated disjunctively ("OR"). The Exchange may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to a single person or to any such set of persons.

<value>: <value> refers to a fantasy-point figure, or, where <above/below/between/exactly/at least> is "between," a pair of fantasy-point figures (a lower bound and an upper bound), specified by the Exchange and expressed in the same <time

period> full-PPR single-quarterback fantasy-point terms as the Underlying. The Exchange may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to variations of <value>.

<above/below/between/exactly/at least>: <above/below/between/exactly/at least> refers to the comparison specified by the Exchange between <player/athlete>'s <time period> figure (the "Measured Value") and <value>. The Exchange specifies exactly one comparison per iteration, evaluated as follows: "above" is satisfied if the Measured Value is strictly greater than <value>; "below" is satisfied if the Measured Value is strictly less than <value>; "at least" is satisfied if the Measured Value is greater than or equal to <value>; "exactly" is satisfied if the Measured Value is equal to <value> at the number of decimal places published by the Source Agency; and

"between" is satisfied if the Measured Value is greater than or equal to the lower bound and less than or equal to the upper bound of <value> (inclusive of both bounds, unless otherwise specified by the Exchange). All comparisons are performed at the number of decimal places published by the Source Agency, with no additional rounding applied by Kalshi.

Payout Criterion: The Payout Criterion for the Contract encompasses the Expiration Values that <player/athlete>'s Measured Value is <above/below/between/exactly/at least> <value> for <time period>.

Additional clarification(s):

- Where <player/athlete> denotes a set of two or more persons, the Payout Criterion is evaluated in accordance with the conjunctive ("AND") or disjunctive ("OR") rule stated in the definition of <player/athlete>.
- If <time period> refers to a particular NFL game or subset of such a game, and it is delayed for 48 hours or less from its originally scheduled start time, all markets in such an event will remain open.
- If <time period> refers to a particular NFL game or subset of such a game, and it is delayed for more than 48 hours from its originally scheduled start time, all markets on that NFL game will resolve to the last fair price as determined by the Exchange in its sole discretion.
- If <player/athlete> is not assigned a value for <time period> by the Source Agency at the Expiration time (for example, because the player did not play, or has been removed from the Source Agency's published listing for any reason), <player/athlete> is deemed to have a <time period> figure of 0.0 fantasy points for purposes of evaluating the Payout Criterion. If <time period> refers to an entire NFL regular season and it is shortened, the season-total is read over the regular-season games actually contested.
- The most recent <time period> figures published by the Source Agency as of the Expiration time govern, and any correction, restatement, or retraction published after the Expiration time is disregarded. If Kalshi determines that the figures published by the Source Agency at the Expiration time were the product of a manifest error, a data-feed failure, or unauthorized manipulation of, or interference with, the Source Agency or its data, Kalshi may determine the Expiration Value in accordance with Rule 7.1 of the Rulebook.

If a natural person who is the primary subject of a Contract's Underlying or Payout Criterion dies prior to Expiration, Kalshi may, in its sole discretion, settle the Contract at the last traded price prior to the death. If Kalshi determines that trading activity was materially affected by the circumstances giving rise to the death, Kalshi may instead use the last traded price prior to such circumstances becoming known or reasonably anticipated by market participants. For purposes of this Rule, Kalshi may rely on an approximate time where the precise time is unknown or

cannot be reasonably determined. If Kalshi determines that no last traded price represents a fair settlement, the Outcome Review Committee shall determine the fair settlement price. Kalshi may halt or pause trading in any such Contract (with public notice on Kalshi's website or the Platform) if it reasonably believes that the death of such person has occurred, is imminent, or that circumstances giving rise to the death may be occurring. Determinations of Kalshi and the Outcome Review Committee under this Rule are final and not subject to review.

Examples that would resolve the market to Yes (iteration: "at least," <value> = 300, <time period>="whole 2026-7 NFL season"):

- At the Expiration time, the Source Agency lists the season-total figure as 312.4. Because $312.4 \geq 300$, the comparison is satisfied. Resolves Yes.

Examples that would NOT resolve to Yes (same iteration):

- Season-total figure of 268.9, which is less than 300. Resolves No.
- Player not assigned a season-total figure and deemed to have 0.0 points, less than 300. Resolves No.

Range example ("between," <value> = 250 to 300):

- Season-total figure of 274.1 is ≥ 250 and ≤ 300 . Resolves Yes.

Minimum Tick: \$0.01.

Position Accountability Level: \$25,000 per strike, per Member.

Last Trading Date: The Last Trading Date will be the same as the Expiration Date. The Last Trading Time will be the same as the Expiration time.

Settlement Date: No later than the day after the Expiration Date, unless under review pursuant to Rule 7.1.

Expiration Date: The latest Expiration Date shall be one week after the end of <time period>. If an event described in the Payout Criterion occurs, expiration may be moved to an earlier date and time in accordance with Rule 7.2.

Expiration time: 10:00 AM ET.

Settlement Value: \$1.00.

Expiration Value: The value of the Underlying as documented by the Source Agency on the Expiration Date at the Expiration time.

Contingencies: Before Settlement, Kalshi may initiate the Market Outcome Review Process per Rule 7.1. If an Expiration Value cannot be determined on the Expiration Date, Kalshi may determine payouts per Rule 7.1.
