Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Commodity Exchange Act and Section 40.2(a) of the regulations of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, KalshiEX LLC (Kalshi), a registered DCM, hereby notifies the Commission that it is self-certifying the “By what time will <outlet> call the <election>?” contract (Contract). The Contract will initially be listed after close-of-business on **September 18, 2025**; it is listed as the day after because of limitations of the Commission's online submission portal. The Exchange intends to list the contract on a **custom** basis. The Contract’s terms and conditions (Appendix A) includes the following strike conditions:

- **<date>**
- **<outlet>**
- **<election>**
- **<time>**

CONCISE EXPLANATION AND ANALYSIS OF THE PRODUCT AND ITS COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, INCLUDING CORE PRINCIPLES AND THE COMMISSION'S REGULATIONS THEREUNDER

Pursuant to Commission Rule 40.2(a)(3)(v), the following is a concise explanation and analysis of the product and its compliance with the Act, including the relevant Core Principles (discussed in Appendix D), and the Commission's regulations thereunder.

I. Introduction

The “By what time will <outlet> call the <election>?” Contract is a contract relating to Elections.

Further information about the Contract, including an analysis of its risk mitigation and price basing utility, as well as additional considerations related to the Contract, is included in Confidential Appendices B, C, and D.

Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Act and CFTC Regulations 40.2(a), the Exchange hereby certifies that the listing of the Contract complies with the Act and Commission regulations under the Act.

General Contract Terms and Conditions: The Contract operates similar to other event contracts that the Exchange lists for trading. The minimum price fluctuation is \$0.01 (one cent). Price bands will apply so that Contracts may only be listed at values of at least \$0.01 and at most \$0.99. Further, the Contract is sized with a one-dollar notional value and has a minimum price fluctuation of \$0.01 to enable Members to match the size of the contracts purchased to their economic risks. As outlined in Rule 5.16 of the Rulebook, trading shall be available at all times outside of any maintenance windows, which will be announced in advance by the Exchange. Members will be charged fees in accordance with Rule 3.13 of the Rulebook. Fees, if they are charged, are charged in such amounts as may be revised from time to time to be reflected on the Exchange’s Website. A new Source Agency can be added via a Part 40 amendment. All instructions on how to access the Underlying are non-binding and are provided for convenience only and are not part of

the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time. Furthermore, the Contract's payout structure is characterized by the payment of an absolute amount to the holder of one side of the option and no payment to the counterparty. During the time that trading on the Contract is open, Members are able to adjust their positions and trade freely. The Expiration Value and Market Outcome are determined at or after Market Close. The market is then settled by the Exchange, and the long position holders and short position holders are paid according to the Market Outcome. In this case, "long position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "Yes" side of the Contract and "short position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "No" side of the Contract. If the Market Outcome is "Yes," meaning that an event occurs that is encompassed within the Payout Criterion, then the long position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the short position holders receive no payment. If the Market Outcome is "No," then the short position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the long position holders receive no payment. Specification of the circumstances that would trigger a Market Outcome of "Yes" are included below in the section titled "Payout Criterion" in Appendix A.

APPENDIX A – CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Official Product Name: “By what time will <outlet> call the <election>?”

Rulebook: ELECTIONTIMECALL

ELECTIONTIMECALL

Scope: These rules shall apply to this contract.

Underlying: The Underlying for this Contract is the first time when <outlet> definitively calls, projects, declares, or otherwise indicates a winner for <election> after Issuance and before <date>. Revisions to the Underlying made after Expiration will not be accounted for in determining the Expiration Value.

Source Agency: The Source Agency is <outlet>.

Type: The type of Contract is an Event Contract.

Issuance: After the initial Contract, Contract iterations will be listed on an as-needed basis at the discretion of the Exchange and corresponding to the risk management needs of Members.

<outlet>: <outlet> refers to a specific news organization, media company, individual, or data provider specified by the Exchange. This includes their primary website, official social media accounts, television broadcasts, or other official communication channels as commonly understood. It may also refer to multiple outlets using AND/OR logic. The outlet remains the same through any re-branding or re-naming.

<election>: <election> refers to a specific electoral contest specified by the Exchange, including the office, jurisdiction, and date. This may include general elections, primary elections, runoff elections, special elections, or referendums. The specific race (e.g., "2024 U.S. Presidential Election" or "2025 Virginia Governor's Race") will be clearly identified.

<time>: <time> refers to specific time thresholds specified by the Exchange.

<date>: <date> refers to a calendar date specified by the Exchange. The Exchange may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to variations of <date>.

Payout Criterion: The Payout Criterion for the Contract encompasses the Expiration Values for when <outlet> makes its first definitive call of a winner for <election> before <time> on <date>. The call must:

- Be an explicit declaration that a candidate or party or option has won, will win, or equivalent clear language indicating <outlet> has determined the winner
 - To be clear, use of the phrase “projected to win” by an outlet or representative of an outlet is alone insufficient to resolve the market; it has to be the outlet’s clear election call
- Appear on one of <outlet>'s primary platforms (main website, television broadcast, or official social media if that is their primary medium)

- Not be prefaced with qualifiers suggesting uncertainty such as "appears to," "likely to," "probably," or "may have"

The relevant time is when the call first becomes publicly visible on <outlet>'s platform, not when it may have been written, decided internally, or prepared for publication. If the call is later retracted, the market nonetheless resolves to Yes.

The following will NOT satisfy the Payout Criterion:

- Preliminary exit polls or early vote counts without a winner declaration
- Reporting that another outlet has called the race
- Conditional statements (e.g., "if these trends continue, X will win")
- Articles or segments discussing scenarios or probabilities without declaring a winner
- User-generated content, opinion pieces, or editorials not representing <outlet>'s official call
- Technical glitches, test posts, or immediately corrected technical errors

If <outlet> never calls <election> before <date>, the Contract will resolve to No.

Examples that would resolve to specific times:

- <outlet> posts "BREAKING: We project John Smith has won the Pennsylvania Senate race" at 11:47 PM ET on their website, and this remains up → Contract resolves to 11:47 PM ET
- <outlet> tweets "Jane Doe will be the next Governor of Virginia, AP projects" at 9:15 PM ET from their official account, if Twitter/X is their recognized primary platform → Contract resolves to 9:15 PM ET
- <outlet>'s television broadcast displays a graphic declaring "Smith Wins Presidency" at 10:30 PM ET → Contract resolves to 10:30 PM ET

Examples that would NOT resolve the Contract:

- <outlet> reports "With 75% of votes counted, Smith leads by 5 points"
- <outlet> publishes "Smith appears headed for victory"
- An <outlet> journalist tweets their personal prediction
- <outlet> accidentally publishes a test result for 3 minutes before removing it

Minimum Tick: The Minimum Tick size for the Contract shall be \$0.01.

Position Accountability Level: The Position Accountability Level for the Contract shall be \$25,000 per strike, per Member.

Last Trading Date: The Last Trading Date of the Contract will be the same as the Expiration Date. The Last Trading Time will be the same as the Expiration time.

Settlement Date: The Settlement Date of the Contract shall be no later than the day after the Expiration Date, unless the Market Outcome is under review pursuant to Rule 7.1.

Expiration Date: The latest Expiration Date of the Contract shall be one week after <date>. If an event described in the Payout Criterion occurs, expiration will be moved to an earlier date and time in accordance with Rule 7.2.

Expiration time: The Expiration time of the Contract shall be 10:00 AM ET.

Settlement Value: The Settlement Value for this Contract is \$1.00.

Expiration Value: The Expiration Value is the value of the Underlying as documented by the Source Agency on the Expiration Date at the Expiration time.

Contingencies: Before Settlement, Kalshi may, at its sole discretion, initiate the Market Outcome Review Process pursuant to Rule 7.1 of the Rulebook. If an Expiration Value cannot be determined on the Expiration Date, Kalshi has the right to determine payouts pursuant to Rule 7.1 in the Rulebook.
