Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Commodity Exchange Act and Section 40.2(a) of the regulations of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, KalshiEX LLC (Kalshi), a registered DCM, hereby notifies the Commission that it is self-certifying the “Will <hurricane> cross <region> before <date>?” contract (Contract). The Contract will initially be listed after close-of-business on **June 25, 2025**; it is listed as the day after because of limitations of the Commission's online submission portal. The Exchange intends to list the contract on a **custom** basis. The Contract’s terms and conditions (Appendix A) includes the following strike conditions:

CONCISE EXPLANATION AND ANALYSIS OF THE PRODUCT AND ITS COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, INCLUDING CORE PRINCIPLES AND THE COMMISSION'S REGULATIONS THEREUNDER

Pursuant to Commission Rule 40.2(a)(3)(v), the following is a concise explanation and analysis of the product and its compliance with the Act, including the relevant Core Principles (discussed in Appendix D), and the Commission's regulations thereunder.

I. Introduction

The “Will <hurricane> cross <region> before <date>?” Contract is a contract relating to Climate and Weather.

Further information about the Contract, including an analysis of its risk mitigation and price basing utility, as well as additional considerations related to the Contract, is included in Confidential Appendices B, C, and D.

Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Act and CFTC Regulations 40.2(a), the Exchange hereby certifies that the listing of the Contract complies with the Act and Commission regulations under the Act.

General Contract Terms and Conditions: The Contract operates similar to other event contracts that the Exchange lists for trading. The minimum price fluctuation is \$0.01 (one cent). Price bands will apply so that Contracts may only be listed at values of at least \$0.01 and at most \$0.99. Further, the Contract is sized with a one-dollar notional value and has a minimum price fluctuation of \$0.01 to enable Members to match the size of the contracts purchased to their economic risks. As outlined in Rule 5.12 of the Rulebook, trading shall be available at all times outside of any maintenance windows, which will be announced in advance by the Exchange. Members will be charged fees in accordance with Rule 3.6 of the Rulebook. Fees, if they are charged, are charged in such amounts as may be revised from time to time to be reflected on the Exchange’s Website. A new Source Agency can be added via a Part 40 amendment. All instructions on how to access the Underlying are non-binding and are provided for convenience only and are not part of

the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time. Furthermore, the Contract's payout structure is characterized by the payment of an absolute amount to the holder of one side of the option and no payment to the counterparty. During the time that trading on the Contract is open, Members are able to adjust their positions and trade freely. The Expiration Value and Market Outcome are determined at or after Market Close. The market is then settled by the Exchange, and the long position holders and short position holders are paid according to the Market Outcome. In this case, "long position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "Yes" side of the Contract and "short position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "No" side of the Contract. If the Market Outcome is "Yes," meaning that an event occurs that is encompassed within the Payout Criterion, then the long position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the short position holders receive no payment. If the Market Outcome is "No," then the short position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the long position holders receive no payment. Specification of the circumstances that would trigger a Market Outcome of "Yes" are included below in the section titled "Payout Criterion" in Appendix A.

APPENDIX A – CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Official Product Name: “Will <hurricane> cross <region> before <date>?”
Rulebook: HURPATH

HURPATH

Scope: These rules shall apply to this contract.

Underlying: The Underlying for this Contract is official hurricane track data from the National Hurricane Center (NHC) for a specified named storm, specifically the storm's path segments where the storm maintains winds at or above <wind_threshold> as documented in consecutive NHC public advisories or forecast advisories containing storm location coordinates, after Issuance and before <date>. Revisions to the Underlying made after Expiration will not be accounted for in determining the Expiration Value.

Instructions: The Underlying can be found at the National Hurricane Center's storm archive at <https://www.nhc.noaa.gov/archive/>. These instructions on how to access the Underlying are provided for convenience only and are not part of the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time.

Source Agency: The Source Agencies are the National Hurricane Center, National Weather Service, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, The Weather Channel, AccuWeather, CNN Weather, Associated Press, Reuters, The New York Times, The Washington Post, The Wall Street Journal, Bloomberg News, and NBC.

Type: The type of Contract is an Event Contract.

Issuance: After the initial Contract, Contract iterations will be listed on an as-needed basis at the discretion of the Exchange and corresponding to the risk management needs of Members.

<storm>: A specific named tropical cyclone designated by the National Hurricane Center during the specified hurricane season, and specified by the Exchange.

<wind_threshold>: The minimum sustained wind speed threshold specified by the Exchange. The Exchange may list iterations of the Contract with <wind_threshold> levels corresponding to:

- Tropical Storm: 39 mph
- Hurricane (Category 1): 74 mph
- Hurricane (Category 2): 96 mph
- Hurricane (Category 3): 111 mph
- Hurricane (Category 4): 130 mph
- Hurricane (Category 5): 157 mph
- Custom thresholds: Any wind speed specified by the Exchange

<region>: A <region> is an enclosed geographic area defined by a border provided by the Exchange. For example, a region could be entitled “Southeast Florida” and encompass Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach counties. Official shapefiles with county boundaries can be obtained from the US Census: <https://www.census.gov/geographies/mapping-files/time-series/geo/cartographic-boundary.html>

<date>: <date> refers to a calendar date specified by the Exchange. The Exchange may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to variations of <date>.

Payout Criterion: The Payout Criterion for the Contract encompasses the Expiration Values where <storm> during <season> has an official track segment at or above <wind threshold> that intersects with or terminates within <region>, after Issuance and before <date>.

A track segment is defined as a straight line connecting two consecutive coordinate positions from National Hurricane Center advisories, where:

1. Both advisories classify the storm as having sustained winds at or above <wind_threshold>
2. The advisories are issued no more than 12 hours apart
3. Both advisories contain specific latitude/longitude coordinates rounded to the nearest 0.1 degree

A track segment intersects with <region> if:

- Any portion of the straight line connecting consecutive hurricane-strength coordinates passes through the geographic boundaries of <region>, OR
- Either coordinate point falls within the boundaries of <region>

Examples that would resolve the market to Yes:

- Hurricane tracks showing coordinates at 25.5N, 80.2W (hurricane strength) followed by 25.8N, 80.0W (hurricane strength), where this line segment crosses Miami-Dade County boundaries
- Hurricane making landfall within the specified region while maintaining hurricane-force winds
- Hurricane passing directly over any portion of the specified region with sustained winds ≥ 74 mph

Examples that would NOT resolve the market to Yes:

- Tropical storm (winds <74 mph) passing through the region (for a hurricane-strength wind threshold)

- Hurricane weakened to tropical storm before entering the region (for a wind threshold of 74 mph)
- Hurricane track passing adjacent to but not intersecting the region boundaries
- Hurricane coordinates from unofficial sources or post-storm analysis

Minimum Tick: The Minimum Tick size for the Contract shall be \$0.01.

Position Accountability Level: The Position Accountability Level for the Contract shall be \$25,000 per strike, per Member.

Last Trading Date: The Last Trading Date of the Contract will be the day prior to <date>. The Last Trading Time will be 11:59 PM ET.

Settlement Date: The Settlement Date of the Contract shall be no later than the day after the Expiration Date, unless the Market Outcome is under review pursuant to Rule 7.1.

Expiration Date: The latest Expiration Date of the Contract shall be one week after <date>. If an event described in the Payout Criterion occurs, expiration will be moved to an earlier date and time in accordance with Rule 7.2.

Expiration time: The Expiration time of the Contract shall be 10:00 AM ET.

Settlement Value: The Settlement Value for this Contract is \$1.00.

Expiration Value: The Expiration Value is the value of the Underlying as documented by the Source Agency on the Expiration Date at the Expiration time.

Contingencies: Before Settlement, Kalshi may, at its sole discretion, initiate the Market Outcome Review Process pursuant to Rule 6.3(d) of the Rulebook. If an Expiration Value cannot be determined on the Expiration Date, Kalshi has the right to determine payouts pursuant to Rule 6.3(b) in the Rulebook.
